Is South Bend Region in Trouble?

I am still convinced that South Bend Region(SBR) is one of the best regions in the country. The primary reason for this is our outstanding core volunteers. We have dozens of members that have committed themselves to promoting SBR and the SCCA. Secondly, we offer a complete lineup of SCCA activities; Solo, Race, Starting Line School and Street Survival. Our events are well run and our competitors are treated like family. But, for the first time in years I was alarmed at the lack of SBR volunteers at our Double Regional race at GingerMan on May 19-20.

What's the Problem?

We might be at the point where we hold too many events. In the past five years we've added SCCA Starting Line School in May, monthly SCCA Track Night in America events from May through August, and most recently, SCCA Time Trials. I've got to admit, much of this has been implemented due to my recommendations as a former Regional Executive and SBR board member.

We've added those events in addition to our traditional Double Regional and Majors races at GingerMan, eight Solo events, two Tire Rack Street Survival courses, the Motor State Challenge and the Afdent Autofest car show. What makes this even tougher is most of our events occur between April and September. For those of you keeping track, that's about twenty events in a six month

time span. This is putting a burden on our volunteer base.

What's the Answer? Option #1

Perhaps the SBR Board needs to consider eliminating the number of events we offer in 2019? It doesn't take a mathematician to calculate the fact that less events will ease the burden on our volunteers. The question is, what do we cut? That's where we need your input. Contact information for each board member can be found on the next page of this publication. Let the SBR Board know if we are asking to much of you.

What's the Answer? Option #2

We need more SBR members to volunteer. As of May 26th we have 354 SBR members. The problem is, we are leaning on the same 25 people to chief and volunteer most of our events. If we keep doing this we will face the real possibility of burning these volunteers out.

We don't need 300 volunteers, we need another 20 at various times of the year.

Where Do We Need Help?

- 1. Assistant Solo Chair. You don't have to take over the entire program, but we do need somebody to take over an event or two. Current Solo Chair, Nick Mawhorr can train you as you go.
- 2. Assistant Street Survival Chair. Sam Centellas has been nationally recognized for

his work with our Street Survival program. It would only be prudent to find Sam an assistant to train for the future.

- 3. Solo Registrars. The more people we have checking people in, the faster the registration process will go.
- 4. Technical Inspection(Race). We need 2-3 people to assist our Tech Chief at our Majors race on July 7-8. You will check gear for racers as they arrive and assist Rod Markowicz in the post-race inspections. We will train you on the job.
- 5. Flagging and Communication (aka corner workers). Six volunteers needed for our Majors race on July 7-8. We will train you on the job, no experience necessary.

Time Trial and Double Regional Report J. Luckritz

It's been a wet spring. We lucked out with relatively good weather for the newly re branded SCCA Time Trials on April 21-22, the SCCA Double Regional road race was a wet and challenging affair. In spite of the weather challenges, the combined efforts of Detroit Region, Western Ohio Region, Indiana Northwest Region and South Bend Region contributed to successful events.

SBR members really stepped it up for the

Time Trials. We only had about 8 weeks to organize, publicize work out the details of the latest SCCA Time Trials. As Time Trial Chair I thought a Time Trial would be like a Track Night "plus." It ended up being a road race "light." Forty volunteers and 55 competitors showed up for two days of exciting action. I hope we do it again.

The Double Regional on May 19-20 had 100 entrants, 27 of which were novices.

Saturday morning consisted of a practice and qualifying session with races in the afternoon. Most of the races were run in the dry and the sun did finally come out; after the last checker of the day. Sunday was a wet affair and many drivers chose not to run Sunday afternoon.

The folks from Detroit Region were "incharge" behind the scenes and did a solid job. Overall, a fun weekend.
