## **Get Involved for Free**

Volunteering is a fantastic way to get involved in racing and it costs nothing. If you don't have any experience we will partner you with somebody that does. You can work Saturday or Sunday, or both days. It's up to you. Here's a brief list of opportunities.

- Registration. Help check people in when they arrive at the track. Primarily Friday evening and the first part of Saturday and Sunday.
- Tech Inspection. Check driver's equipment, weigh cars, and assist in vehicle inspection.
- Grid. Direct drivers to the appropriate grid position and make sure they are properly buckled in.
- Flagging and Communications. Work one of the eight corner stations around the track and communicate with drivers through the use of flags.
- Timing and Scoring. You will be located in the third floor of the tower and assist in keeping track of the position of each driver during qualifying and the races.
- Course Marshall. Assist in recovering stranded vehicles on the track.

# Get on Track for Minimal Cost-No Competition License Required

A SCCA Track Event is a great way to get your street car on track. In general, as long as your car is safe you should be good to go. We follow the rules for the SCCA Track Night in America program (<a href="www.tracknightinamerica.com">www.tracknightinamerica.com</a>) for convertibles so be sure to check out their website if you have a convertible. You will need to bring and wear an approved helmet that is rated SA2005 or M2005 or newer. Instruction will be provided for Novice drivers and passing will only be allowed on the straights with a point-by. This is not door to door racing, it is an opportunity to drive your street car at speed on a race track.

# Race with a Buddy-No Competition License Required

The SCCA Club Racing Experience(CRE) Endurance Racing is your opportunity to race door to door in a fully caged race car with fenders. There will be classes for Spec Racer Ford 3, Spec Miata and three Bracket Classes. Bracket racing classes are determined by your lap times therefore race cars from ChampCar, NASA, LeMons and other sanctioning bodies are welcome as long as they look like race cars. Another unique aspect to this kind of racing is it allows you to race with a buddy since a pit stop is required for each race. All drivers will be given classroom instruction and their on-track behavior will be monitored to help ensure everybody is having a great time. Drivers must wear all the required safety gear from head to toe.

## Regional Racing-Time to Step It Up a Notch-SCCA Competition License Required(or similar)

SCCA Regional Racing is for all the recognized SCCA classes. Formula cars, prototypes, GT cars and everything in-between. This form of door-to-door racing will be a little more intense than CRE, but in general drivers are there to have a good time on track.

# **Solo Update**

After much discussion amongst the solo team and the club board, our solo season kicked off at Grissom on May 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. We set a 50 participant per day threshold to hold the event and reached this within 24 hours. Attention quickly turned to how many participants we could manage and meet SCCA and Indiana COVID-19 guidelines, which we agreed would be 120, and was reached within 72 hours. Fortunately, they have decided to open the track for use on Sunday's for the time being, with some additional rules in place. As of this writing we are at 78 of 90 allowed entrants. At the end of last season, he agreed to take the position of Solo Co-Chair, and will be working with me throughout this season to learn some of the ins and outs of organizing and running events.
