The Trans-Am name was created by SCCA, meaning as "Trans American sedan Championship". They registered "Trans-Am" as a trademark name in 1970, therefore causing Pontiac to come to SCCA to license the name, creating a nice financial windfall for SCCA for future years.

Currently cars running the TA class are full out and out racing cars. They are tube frame chassis, Kevlar and carbon fibre bodies, 366 cubic inch carbureted engines producing 850 horsepower and huge tires.

LANE MOTORSTATE CHALLENGE REPORT

As usual the Motorstate Challenge by Lane went off very well. Here is the event from my perspective as SBR chair for it.

There was a brief meeting at Lane on Thursday for all the participants. This being an unusual year for all things was actually held outside in the Lane Automotive parking lot to maintain some social distancing. After that meeting it was time for the annual Thursday night cruise. We left Lane with a full Berrien County police escort of 8 motorcycle units and the chief in his SUV. The cruise proceeded to go thru southwest Michigan to Silver Beach in St. Joseph and then wound it's way back to the home base motel in Watervliet. There we were greeted by a dinner that was again a bit different due to the virus. Good food as usual.

Friday morning we began a very long day. Tech opened up early as usual and we were done by 7:45. Cars were on track on time and ran very well according to usual ending up early for lunch. We then moved up the afternoon starting time by 10 minutes and the afternoon went very well. A couple of roll-back pickups but very minor things.

Friday being done the workers then settled in for the SCCA Track Night in America segment. Didn't go very well and ended up around 8:15 P.M. That is approximately 13 hours for you that weren't there. A long day. Kudos to those workers.

Saturday morning we were ready to get our timing set up. Joe Jamison and Harold Miller arrived at 7 to set up the timing. By 7:45 we were ready for cars. Way better than last year. Being that the drivers requested that we not run the course in reverse we changed that portion of the event from planned to go race direction for about 80% of the track. Theory was to eliminate the long straights to level the playing field for all the cars. (high horsepower means fast straights) By the time the first car took to the track it was 8:05. All drivers got 6 runs on the course with 4 reruns due to cars off course. No timing issues were had. All together we were complete before 10 a.m. Results were quickly tabulated and awards given out. So in my mind the event went very well due to the great volunteers from SBR.

There was some requests to even make Saturday even shorter and end it before turn 10 to further eliminate the straights. We will look into that for next year. Also discussed over the event was the possibility to take Saturday back to the Tire Rack. I haven't heard the results of that yet.

Thanks again for the members that came to make this event great for me and the competitors. Many thanks from the drivers were received during the weekend. We couldn't do this without you.
