2020 Results

South Bend Region members have been gathering every Fall at Michiana Raceway Park for over ten years. Typically, we have just over 20 members taking part in the event, but this year 12 people show up to compete against each other and the bumpy road course in South Bend. Our driver count may have been down due to COVID-19, but those that showed up were intense and extremely competitive.

Equipped with our own closed-face helmets, long pants and closed-toe shoes we took part in a 5-minute practice session. This may not sound like a long time, but we are turning laps in the 40-second range and the track surface is extremely bumpy. I can't speak for everybody, but the g-forces through the corners put enormous pressure on my forearms and hands.

We took a 5-minute break after the practice session and headed out to the track for a 5-minute qualifying session. Normally we have a larger turnout and we run in two groups. But, since there were only 12 of us that meant we only had short breaks. Needless to say, this 55-year old guy was pretty pooped after 10-minutes of track time. Denny Jennings and Kim Bollinger were spectating and decided that we would invert the field for the 15-minute race. Slow guys in the front and fast guys in the back.

There were several on-track incidents during the race but everybody still seemed to have a good time. Brian Tack was the first person to take the checkered flag followed by Joe Sawyer and Bill Loring. You can see the completer results below.

Tired of TV???

If you are tired of watching reruns on TV, you can get your cat fix by viewing an upcoming local rare/ unique Auction website. The actual Auction is to be held Oct 23-24 at the Elkhart Co Airport along with on-line bidding. This is part of Najeeb Kahn's collection with at last count 285 cars along with auto memorabilia, shop equipment, and even auto themed stuff for the house. The cars had NO Reserve, but too many items for me to check all. To view preview cars go to https://rmsothebys.com. "Click" on magnifying glass at upper right. Type Elkhart collection in search line, select "all motor vehicles" from middle pull down menu, and "click" on SEARCH. There are close to 600 items, so if you want to see more than cars then select "all Categories" from middle pull down menu. They display at 40 per page. If one "clicks" on item you will see several additional photos including close up details and sometimes serial numbers. This action also gives additional written description on items, many times including specifics and car's life history. Word has it that on Thursday before Auction one can pay \$20 to get in and view. Think about it....being local one can bid, win, and pick up item and save on shipping.

David drag raced a 1969 Mustang MACH 1 in the 1970's and early 1980's.

In 1982 - 1987 we managed a 24 hour service station with gas, repairs and towing service. A non stop business was our priority! After that David went on the road as an Over the Road truck driver. He loved being on the road, which meant there was no time for anything else.

In 1996, a trip was made to Battle Mountain Nevada for the Pony Express road race. A race that was run on the highway with all the side roads and personal drives that were silver mines blocked. That race was done in a 1994 Mustang GT, Again in 1997, with the 1969 Mustang MACH 1. She had a 2 day old paint job and took the 'ULTIMATE DREAM CAR' at the event. Both races had a Pilot and Co-pilot. Peggy was the Co-pilot.

Now into 2004, we head to the Nashville Super Speedway for a road race on the road course inside the track. The 1969 had track time and the 1994 was there for everything else. The cars had to park about 2 football fields apart. What a walk! 2009 was the 45th Mustang Birthday at Barber Motorsports in Leeds Alabama. This is a very wide track for motorcycles. Well maintained. 1994 Mustang GT got to do the honors this time! 2014 was the 50th Mustang Birthday at Charlotte Motor Speedway. Again the 1969 Mustang MACH 1 was on the road course inside the track.

In 2016 it was the 40th MCA (Mustang Club of America) celebration at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. The first car club to have the track at higher speeds, The 1969 Mustang MACH 1 was on the road course. The front straight-away he was doing 123MPH. The road course is run opposite of the Indy 500. Now we move to 2019. 55th Mustang Birthday and opening of the Mustang Owners Museum at Charlotte Motor Speedway. The road course has been redesigned and now called the ROVAL. We take the 2018 Mustang GT Automatic with the Performance Pack. This puts him in a different class. He doesn't mind because now he has the braking power and speed to keep up with the rest of the high performers, GT 500's and Boss 302's!

We joined SBR after Denny Jennings convinced us in November 2017. We wanted to be workers, flagging and grid were our choices. All workers jobs are important to each race because without the workers there would be no event. We enjoy members events at Gingerman. The road racing is a little closer to home and just enough to satisfy the NEED FOR SPEED. There are some cool and unique cars you see while flagging and working grid. The drivers and other people you meet while flagging has been in the SCCA a lot longer than us and have some interesting

Laurel Racing part 2

Construction of the second generation Camaro began. With help from Chevrolet's Bill Howell, Laurel Racing developed the 1970 Camaro. In addition to parts and engineering from Chevrolet, more help came form Goodyear via a sponsorship agreement to provide tires in exchange for Goodyear decals on all four fenders.

The finished car was painted white with red lettering and red wheels.

By May of 1971, the Camaro was well sorted. Larry Bock in wet conditions at Lime Rock qualified 14th in a field of 31 TA competitors.

Later in 1971, Fushida Racers formed a sponsorship agreement with Laurel Racing to fund an effort with Hiroshi Fushida driving the car. Hiroshi had never driven a sedan prior to the effort, but quickly proved capable and could give good feedback and set up changes.

Later in the season, while my family and I were sitting at Road America's Canada corner watching the Trans-Am race, a spectacular accident happened in front of us. Hiroshi lost control, crashed thru a guard rail and hit a tree pinning him in the car for 2 hours while emergency crews worked to get him free. He spent 2 days in the hospital with numerous broken bones. Hiroshi never raced in the TA series again, but he continued driving in other series.

The car was repaired and returned to racing.

Somewhere around 2005, the Camaro was restored and began competing in vintage races and concours events on the west coast.

I raced Sprites in H Production for 18 years with moderate success (a few wins.....but lots of fun). I decided to walk away from the car in 2018. The last three years, I have competed exclusively in Solo events in my Chevrolet Bolt in HS. As it's a full electric car (all torque), it's made for the tight, twisty confines of a Solo course and it's a blast to drive.....on the course as well as the street.
