RE REPORT

We are finishing the competition season with a bang this year packing in Solo Nationals, Hoosier Challenge, the final Track Night in America, and our SBR/Detroit Regional race all in one month! This all would not be possible without the competitors, workers and organizers. It takes a team to pull all of this off and SCCA does it best. But wait.... there's more! The runoffs at VIR, the final SBR autocross at Tire Rack on Sunday 10/15 and our first SBR Trek Rally on Saturday 10/21. The SBR Trek Rally has nothing to do with "Warp Drive" or "Starships", but it sounds like great fun involving a relaxing cruise with your SBR friends motoring through the country in their fine cars and taking in the fall colors. Best of all, it is totally free! This is yet another fun SBR social event for our members and their guests pulled together by Denny Jennings. Make sure you sign up and rollout before the weather forces us back inside for the season. Look for more info elsewhere in this issue.

Part of a successful club is having good leadership and members stepping up to show us the way and make us a better club. This is where the members steer us in the right direction by nominating and electing our future Regional Board of Directors as well as our Area #4 national Director. We are accepting nominations for the SBR 2024 Board members at the October and November General Membership meeting. I am stepping down from the Regional Executive position after two terms and will now maintain a seat on the Board of Directors for 2024 per our club ByLaws. We will need to nominate and elect a new RE as well as three voting Board Members for 2024. Elections for the nominees will be held in person on Tuesday November 7th. Running for the SCCA Area 4 Director is Dayle Frame our current Director for the Great Lakes Division. Dayle is running for his second term. Dan Hodge from Ohio is running against him for the Director position. Make sure you vote with SCCA for our Director between 10/1 and 10/15.

I have more info to relay from my meeting on September 19th with the other Regional Leadership and Mike Cobb, SCCA President. The SCCA National Convention will be virtual like last year and will be presented during the week of January 18-26, 2024. The Great Lakes Division will have our convention in-person on March 2nd in Ft. Wayne. More info to follow. SCCA Academy now has F&C Courses available to all members through the Member Account Portal (MAP) under the tab "My Learning" Go to "Course Registration". This will be a process to eventually license F&C workers and elevate training to Pro levels of racing.

Mike Cobb also shared news that *SportsCar* magazine will no longer be a print publication that members receive bimonthly [beyond the January/February 2024 issue]. Mike Cobb explained this an opportunity to reinvest in other Club communication channels, which could include website upgrades, expanding SCCA's digital outreach, and improving online capabilities – and that this redirected investment *may* include having *SportsCar* come to life in the future as both an analog and digital presentation.

In closing, we need a volunteer to help us plan and organize our January SBR awards banquet. Finances have been a little tight with some of our programs and our necessary expenditures, so our "Banquet" may look a little different than past years. We will try to be creative and fun while celebrating our past wins. If you have ideas and can help, let the Board know soon as most venues book for January in the next 30 days. We can really use a leader in place for this in the next week or so for this to happen.

Track Night in America 2023

For me, it's Track Night in America (tracknightinamerica.com), or TNiA for short. TNiA is an SCCA sanctioned program with events held at a variety of tracks across the country with the chief sponsor being Tire Rack (tirerack.com). The South Bend Region hosts events through the season at Gingerman Raceway in South Haven, Michigan.

TNiA is where I get to play and rely on volunteers from the South Bend Region to make it happen. Here's a snap of the crew getting prepped for the night and checking drivers in. You can see it takes many folks to make a Track Night in America happen.





All kinds of folks help out through the season, but there are some regulars worth noting. First off, Dave Gushwa took on administering the program and has kept it running smoothly with lots of fun while keeping, let's say, the overly excited types in line with the program. Dave and Peggy Anson have spent so much time at the corner station at Turn 3 that surely they have decorated the interior by now. Duane Belisle, Leon Krauss, H.C. Colwell, Dave Bowman, Susan Miller, Steve Hempel, Mark Manninen, Scott Lickteig, and Kim Bollinger have kept the administration as well as the track operating smoothly and safely through the season.

Over time, with good instruction and great experiences, novices turn into more advanced drivers who return regularly. At least that was my experience. I often get some big waves with big smiles from little folks and big folks alike.

That is a tribute to the program as well as our region. There were plenty of novice drivers which bodes well for the future health of the program. This year in particular, it seemed all the drivers were more open to saying "Hi!" to your neighbor in the paddock. I made some new friends who are not South Bend Region members. We were excited to see each other month after month. They are all committed to coming back next year. Below are some pictures of the line ups in the paddock.
