If you look down the list, you'll see many familiar names. Members and past members of the South Bend Region have been prominent in the annals of solo competition since its beginning as a national sport.

Herewith a listing of the SBR folks I recognized who are in this elite group. They are listed in the order shown and the number next to the name is the number of National Championships won. Their actual ranking also included other data such as other finishes, number of events entered, etc. Joyce Looman's 15 wins is the 2nd highest in the history of Solo. And with Joyce Looman, Kim Bollinger, and Steve Tamandli we have three drivers in the top ten! Congratulations to all. These are significant achievements. And if I missed anyone, my apologies, but it was pretty small print.





The 2002 Solo and Road Racing season is here and with it comes a flurry of activity in preparation for the first events of the season. As the secretary for the CenDiv Regional Championship series I have been busy working on the finishing touches for this year's rules. One thing we are doing different this year is to mail a postcard directing competitors to the cendiv.org website to download the rules and registration form, or they can call a toll free number to have it mailed to them. Or if you are a South Bend member just let me know and I can print one out for you. One new addition to the series is the Spec Miata class, which promises to be an affordable way to go racing.

As part of preparing for the 2002 season, CenDiv held its spring training at the South Bend Holiday Inn. The CenDiv Solo folks did an excellent job with a full schedule of Solo related seminars at the Tire Rack. Some race specialties such as flagging and communications, timing, and stewards also conducted training. My time was full with Regional Championship meetings, RE

meetings and Race scheduling meetings. The Race scheduling meetings were to address and find a solution to the present problems of too many races scheduled in the Central Division. After attending scheduling meetings on Friday Night, Saturday, and Sunday a few things became very clear, one of which is that the division is no closer to a solution than we were at the roundtable in October. Another thing that is clear is that there are some major factions who will not compromise at all. The South Bend region along with Indiana Northwest, Fort Wayne and Western Michigan regions are stuck in the middle of the issues of who, when, where, and how many races regions are allowed to schedule. The one good thing that has come out of it is that the working relationship between Western Michigan and South Bend continues to grow stronger and new relationships are developing with Indiana Northwest and Fort Wayne.

Our solo program may be down but it is not out, actually it is alive and kicking. A solo meeting was held at the Tire Rack this past month to plan for our upcoming season. With the loss of the old Tire Rack site the program will undergo some major changes this year. At this time we may have events at Grissom, Buchanan, Lake Michigan College in St. Joseph MI, and maybe even one or two at the old site. While this may be a challenging year for the solo program, I'm very confident that it will be a very successful one.

The preparation for my racing season is running somewhat behind schedule. I had hoped to

race at Memphis in March, unfortunately I am still waiting for a cam from Crower to complete the engine and didn't have the car ready. My next goal is to make it to Summit Point West Virginia the first week of April. All the work during the off-season has been on the engine in an attempt to solve the power and reliability problems I had last year. Other than that the car is pretty much unchanged from last year. The car and driver are both overweight and unrefined, but for now the main goal is to develop more power and finish races. If all goes well this season (I'm crossing my fingers and toes) I'll start some of the refinements to the car during the next off-season. I will close my notes for this month by wishing the entire region's competitors, workers, and families a successful and safe 2002 season.

### 2002 South Bend Region, SCCA Official Solo II Scoring Rules

Current event results, point standings, and event flyers are available at: http://homepage.mac.com/sbrscca/

1. To qualify for any of our annual SBR Solo II Championships, you must run at least three (3) events during the season. Your five (5) best finishes will be used when calculating points for each championship. Entry is automatic for eligible contestants and is based on the information you provide on your entry blank at each event.

#### Tire Rack Index Challenge

2. The Tire Rack Index Challenge is based on all SBR solo points events and is open to all competitors. Every competitor's score will be computed using their best event time multiplied by their car class PAX/RTP Index Factor. All competitors are competing against each other; there are no car classes except to determine your PAX/RTP Index Factor. After the PAX/RTP Index has been applied to your best time, your points will be calculated based on the formula shown in item #10 below.

#### **Novice Championship**

3. The Novice Championship is open only to drivers in their first full season of competition. Scoring will be identical to the Tire Rack Index Challenge,

using the PAX/RTP index. You need not be an SBR member to win, but you must run at least 3 events.

#### SBR Solo II Class Championship

- 4. In order to qualify for the South Bend Region Solo II Class Championship, you must be a member of South Bend Region, SCCA at the end of the competition year. Dual memberships are available for only \$15.00/yr for those who are already members of another SCCA region. Car classes include all National SCCA classes plus whatever local classes may be established.
- 5. The SBR Championship Series is based on your finish in your car class at each points event. Your points are calculated based on how close you come to the winning time in your class using the formula shown in item #10. The class winner always receives 100 points. Points go down from there, and all competitors will receive a minimum of 10 points per event. While drivers may compete in several classes during the year, only one class will be counted for year-end awards.
- 6. Ladies classes parallel the open SBR car classes. Lady drivers will be scored in the ladies class unless they choose to enter the open class at each event.

#### **Street Tire Challenge**

7. The Street Tire Challenge offers a separate championship for all SBR members not running "race" tires. It also uses the PAX/RTP Index to equalize the cars running in this group. An exclusion list for "race" tires will be available at the event.

#### **General Rules**

- 8. We hope to reduce or eliminate bumping for event trophies this year. However, if you are bumped to a faster class, you will still receive annual points based on your actual car class for all championships. Example: CP gets bumped to BP and finishes in 2nd place. The CP driver receives 100 points for winning CP in the SBR Class Championship. For all "indexed" championships, your PAX/RTP Index will always be based on your actual car class, not the class you were bumped into for the day.
- 9. The number of year end trophies will be based on current SCCA Solo II Rules for the number of qualified competitors in each class for the SBR Solo II Series, and the total qualified drivers in all classes competing in each ofthe other championships.
- 10. Points in each class are calculated as follows:

  POINTS = 100 (900 x ((Entrant's Time Class Winning Time) / Class Winning Time))
- 11. All annual championship trophies will be awarded at the SBR Annual Banquet in January after the season.
- 12. Event trophies will be awarded to class, Novice Index and Street Tire Index winners at the conclusion of each points event.

place if we didn't have the worker staffs to help run the show. After which the workers will go to their stations for the remaining "on the job" training. Sunday is a single day race event, so you can put to use what was learned the day before.

Any workers committing to a full day's work, Saturday, Sunday or both, will be taken care of by the VSCDA with a worker gift, meals and door prizes. Gary Peterson, our Chief of Worker Appreciation will see to that.

This is an excellent opportunity to hone new skills for those that attended the worker seminar in South Bend. ### Racing in 2002 Jim Desemberg

Race chair persons like me are becoming paranoid about having to cancel an event due to low worker turn out. Two events were canceled last year. The new Executive Chief Steward, Wally Sunderland has declared that he will not allow races to be staged with an unsafe number of workers. We rely on our neighbor regions for support to put on our race, and we must (and do) support their racing efforts. For all of you current and hopefully new workers, it is more important than ever to let people know that you intend to work an event ahead of time. Please, if you are planning to work an event, contact the chief of your specialty or the race chair of the event to let them know you are coming. F&C people can let me know and I will pass the information on. If you have ever wanted to become involved in any of the race worker activities, this would be a great year to get started. Whatever event or events you can work, your presence will be greatly appreciated. F&C training is going to be available at two upcoming local events, the VSCDA School May 4th and 5th, and the combined region Drivers School May 18th and 19th. Both of those schools are at GingerMan. Ann Kumor from Milwaukee will be providing Timing and Scoring training at our race. We are still looking for a chief of T&S.

Bill Howe and I attended the CENDIV Spring Training Program. The RE's of the Racing Regions and the Race Chair's worked on the problems that lead to the hold up of approval for the 2002 racing schedule, and what the ground rules should be for next year. No set agreement on how to solve our problems was reached, but the regions that race in Michigan; WMR, INR, South Bend, Detroit, Fort Wayne, and Lake Superior have agreed to all get together and work on next year's race dates as a group. There is no desire to have a CENDIV race committee that would dictate race dates and regions. There is still an inequity of National races between area four and area five that no one has come up with a solution to.

The feeling is that Area four drivers do not like to go the area five events, and area five drivers do not want to go to area four events. I can see someone from Eastern Ohio not wanting to go to Brainerd, or someone from Minnesota not wanting to go to Nelson Ledges. South Bend Region is in the middle of CENDIV. Our region appears to be an exception in that we have pulled drivers and workers from all over CENDIV. My car count of the 2001 South Bend Sprints was:

Detroit 35, Chicago 27, WMR 11, Indy 10, South Bend 9, Milwaukee 6, NEO 4, LOL 4, OVR 4, INR 3, SVR 2, others 5.

Now if we had a good data base of workers, we would probably see about the same division.

For some time now drivers and workers have been saying "there are too many races." The quandary is, no region wants to give up "their race and their race date;"

they want someone else to drop off the schedule. Then they have more drivers and workers for their own race. Taking a cue from a popular television show, I suggest we poll all 1,300 + drivers and all of the workers in CENDIV and find out how they rate the National and Regional events, and start eliminating the "weakest links" until every one is happy. Reality is, drivers and workers already do this. They choose what events to compete and work at. When a race is cancelled due to low car count or worker count it costs a region track rent and many other expenses, plus the region's credibil-
