

RE Notes Jeff Luckritz

As a racing enthusiast and a driver education instructor, I think I know a thing or two about good driving skills and driving habits. One of my favorite magazines, Autoweek,



devoted an entire issue to driver education programs in this country.

The main theme of the articles is that drivers in America, especially teen drivers, are ill-equipped to be considered safe on our roads. They cite lots of statistics about teenage deaths and the attitudes that we as Americans have regarding these deaths. It's true that 16-19 year olds are the statistically the worst drivers, and I totally agree with their facts. It's their solution that I have a problem with.

The authors contend that sending teens to advanced driving skills that teach emergency lane changes, threshold braking and skid control is the cure-all to reducing teen deaths. In this "experts" opinion, advanced driving schools may help, but they won't significantly reduce teen deaths on our roads.

In my unofficial surveys in talking with teen drivers who have had accidents, car control is not the issue. Attitude and carelessness is. One teen from a local high school lay in a coma for months because she didn't stop at a stop sign and got broadsided by a car going 55 mph on a country road. Another teen rolled her pickup truck because she was distracted by her fellow passengers, yet another was given a 400 hp Pontiac GTO and wrecked it on the very next day when she crossed the yellow line and ran into a family of 4, killing one, paralyzing another and seriously injuring the other two. All tragic stories that have nothing to do with being able to control a car like a race car driver and having everything to do with being immature.

At the National Championship Runoffs this year, SCCA is making a special effort to get more members involved in our club. There are a few programs already in place (the Region Road Trip Challenge for one) that has generated a lot of interest and some friendly competition among Regions.

Participation is loosely defined in that the intent is not to put a rookie on a corner, for example. The intent is to bring that person right to the hub of activity and be an observer in a position that won't negatively affect operation of the specialty. However, if the local area manager (Corner Captain, i.e.) feels the VIP is capable, then that person can perform rudimentary functions.

We will also award two SCCA membership renewals per day (eight total) of those that have entered the drawings.

All of the specialty National Administrators are in support of this program, and hopefully we can gain not only new recruits to the various Club Racing specialties, but instill the enthusiasm needed for new memberships and a more activated membership.
